I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this declaration, and 18 if called upon to testify to the same, I could and would do so. 19 2. In 2017, Steve Dietrich and I founded Smith & Dietrich Law Offices, PLLC (or 20 SDLO), a law firm in Olympia, Washington primarily focused on serving individual clients in 21 consumer protection and employment matters. The firm's attorneys represent clients in both 22 complex litigation and individual representation cases. Mr. Dietrich and I have represented 23 consumer clients in disputes with a diverse range of defendants including automobile 24 manufacturers and retailers, landlords, real estate professionals, companies involved in 25 telemarketing, and financial institutions. 3. I graduated with honors from the University of Washington Law School in 2013.

As a law student, I was awarded the American Bar Association's Janet D. Steiger Fellowship

which allowed me to work as a law clerk for the antitrust and consumer protection divisions of

the Washington Attorney General's Office. I also worked as a judicial extern for the Honorable

Karen Overstreet in the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the Western District of Washington. After

being admitted to the bar in Washington in 2013, I worked as an Assistant Attorney General in

the Washington Attorney General's Office division handling civil Medicaid fraud enforcement

matters, then in the campaign finance enforcement division of the Office. I am a current

- 6. SDLO has spent more than 100 hours litigating this matter. I was the attorney primarily responsible for reviewing the work of the SDLO timekeepers who worked on this matter. I supervised all work to avoid duplication of effort and to encourage efficiency. I also reviewed the firm's billing records and reduced or eliminated time where appropriate.
- 7. pay for litigation costs would ever be compensated. Only in the event of a successful case resolution was there any likelihood of these amounts being paid. Given the complexity of this litigation, even though we were confident in the strength of our claims, there was also the potential that this action could have continued for years including potential appeals. Our firm's work in this action meant that we had less time to devote to other paying matters we could have worked on since 2019.

- 8. Our firm recognizes that Plaintiff and the Class face significant risk from continued litigation. The settlement agreement negotiated by the parties eliminates any litigation risks and awards significant monetary and other relief to the members of the settlement class. Given these considerations, we believe the settlement is fair, reasonable, and adequate, and that it is in the best interest of the Settlement Class as a whole.
- 9. SDLO sets its rates for attorneys based on a variety of factors, including among others the experience, skill, and sophistication required for the types of legal services typically performed; the rates customarily charged in similar matters; and the experience, reputation, and ability of the attorneys.
- 10. Our lodestar calculations are based on reasonable hourly rates, and state courts in Washington have approved fee requests by SDLO. Recent cases where our attorneys' rates were approved as reasonable include *State v. Eyman*, No. 17-2-01546-34 (order entered September 30, 2019 approving hourly rates for Walter Smith for work performed before July 2017) and *Diel v. Salal Credit Union*, No. 19-2-10266-7 KNT (class action settlement final approval order).
